Registration Fee \$25.00 (per camper) This is a one time non-refundable fee regardless of how many weeks your camper attends.

Depending on the cost of outings, if a guide chooses to add an adventure of additional cost, the fees may be adjusted minimally.

Lunch and Snacks

Full day students need to bring a lunch. Snacks are provided by the camp and are included in the registration price.

Notes

Tuition is due the first day of the month. Should enrollment for any of the weeks fall below the required number of 10, CBMS will cancel the class and you will receive a refund for any money paid for that week. If you choose to cancel or not attend, a two-week notice **MUST** be given. If we are not notified, you will still be committed to pay for the week you signed up to attend.

Families receive 10% off tuition on the second child. (and 3rd, 4th...)

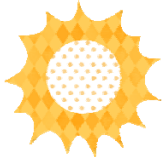
There is a late charge of \$10.00 for each 10 minutes of late pick up, after 6:00.

Toddler/Primary Summer Camp Sessions

Ages 18 months to 5 years

Toddler Camp (ages: 18 months - 3 years)

Ten lucky toddlers will have the opportunity to spend a day in a cozy environment designed just for them. The Toddler program will provide an abundance of experiences, activities, and projects in a relaxed, yet stimulating, and nurturing atmosphere. Daily activities will include: small and large motor development, exploring nature, games, gardening, songs, dance, cooking, and much more. The toddlers will also participate in weekly on-site special events and a designated water day.

Primary Camp (ages: 3 - 5 years)

This camp will provide 18 children with a wealth of experiences, activities, and projects in a relaxed, yet stimulating, and nurturing environment. The children will engage in hands-on learning activities that will expose them to science, practical life skills, and sensory explorations. They will also engage in various art projects, games, nature studies, and much more. There will be weekly entertainment along with a designated water day.

Both our Toddler and Primary Communities will run similar to our programs we offer throughout the year here at CBMS. Students will be under the guidance of our Montessori employees who will honor Dr. Montessori's philosophy and recommendations from their current classroom guides. Our programs will be enriched through summer fun activities, too. Students will take part in craft projects, music fun, and organized gross motor activities. This summer camp will provide your primary child with the fabulous opportunity to continue the many grace and courtesy lessons, community care, practical life, and academic works he/she takes part in throughout the school year. Having even a few weeks of this experience will make the return to school in the fall an easy transition. We foresee these communities filling up quick, so please understand how important it is to register soon.

Elementary Summer Camp Adventures

Ages 6-12 years old OR Rising 1st-6th graders

Week 1: June 1-5, AM: Cooking Clinic, PM: Botany/Nature

During the morning sessions this week, campers will learn the basics in the kitchen. Students will plan, shop, and prepare meals for their daily lunches. Following lunch, the campers will get lessons in Botany and discover different aspects of nature as they go on nature walks, scavenger hunts, etc.. (Morning campers will need to bring in \$5.00 to help with groceries, however, you will not have to bring a lunch.)

Week 2: June 8-12, AM: Arts and Crafts, PM: Outdoor Fun

During this week, the morning sessions will be fun-filled with lots of arts and crafts to make and take! In the afternoons, the campers will try their skills at a few sports lessons, activities may include, but not limited to, basketball, volleyball, tennis, and relays. (Afternoon campers will want to bring a cool water bottle daily.)

Week 3: June 15-19, AM: Outdoor Fun, PM: Teamwork & Collaboration

This exciting week will begin with mornings filled with activity, Basketball, Flag-Football, Volleyball, and more. Following a lunch break we will be learning about cooperation and teamwork through various building activities using Legos and K'nex. Campers will be given challenges to work together to complete.

Week 4: June 22-26, AM: Highlights in History, PM: Playing in the Past

Campers who join us for this week will be introduced to many historical events and studies. These topics may be introduced through timelines, story telling, or research. In the afternoons we will enjoy the fun and games of our former generations like Badminton, Croquet, Frisbee, Wiffleball, Hopscotch, etc. This should be an enjoyable learning experience for all.

Elementary Summer Camp Adventures (continued)

Week 5: June 29- July 3, AM: Basics of Photography, PM: Pet Care

During these morning sessions, campers will learn techniques in basic photography and how to make quality pictures. In the afternoon sessions, children will learn basic pet care needs and skills in raising different kinds of animals. (Morning campers will need to bring their own digital camera to use.)

Week 6: July 6-10, AM: Brain Gym, PM: Games of Strategy

This week will be filled with learning opportunities to enhance the campers' current academic skills and challenge their learning during the summer. The mornings will focus on practicing academics such as math, language, and reading. The afternoons will be a time of learning strategy games like chess and practicing many brainteasers, puzzle activities, and Mensa games.

Week 7: July 13-17, AM: Science, PM: Drama

Mad Scientists, our morning campers will become; under the direction of CBMS' favorite scientist herself, Mary Beth will guide the students through CSI techniques to solve a mystery. In the afternoon, the mystery will unfold with direction from our talented Ms. Rachael Shaw, as she teaches the campers the basics of acting and drama presentations.

Week 8: July 20-24, AM: Art History, PM: Yoga, Relaxation, and Stress Reducing Techniques for Children

The mornings during this week will begin with a focus on Art History, highlighting different artists and styles. Campers will learn to study art, and the different techniques the artists' use. Following lunch and some outdoor activities, campers will have some basic yoga instruction and learn different stress relieving skills they can use throughout their life.

Week 9: July 27-31, AM: Math Madness, PM: Music

What a way to end the summer. Morning sessions will provide campers with some fun and exciting extensions to the math skills they learn throughout the year. Students are sure to end the week with a stronger confidence in this area of their academics. The afternoons will come alive through music. Ms. Shaw will provide group music instruction and fun.
