Program Hours

Half Day - 8:30 a.m. – noon

Full Day - 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

After Care Hours - 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.

- After Care begins following dismissal
- Scheduled After Care charges do not begin until 4:00 p.m.
- Scheduled After Care, \$5.00 per hour or any portion of an hour
- Drop In After Care (unscheduled), \$10.00 per hour or any portion of an hour

Tuition and Fees

Half Day (8:30 a.m. – noon) - \$85.00 weekly

Full Day (8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.) - \$160.00 weekly

Registration Fee – \$25.00 per camper

- This is a one time non-refundable fee, regardless of how many weeks your camper attends

Lunch and Snacks

Full day students need to bring a lunch. Snacks are provided by the camp and are included in the registration price.

Notes

Tuition is due the first day of the month. Should enrollment for any of the weeks fall below the required number of 10, CBMS will cancel the class and you will receive a refund for any money paid for that week. If you choose to cancel or not attend, a two-week notice **MUST** be given. If we are not notified, you will still be committed to pay for the week you signed up to attend.

There is a late charge of \$10.00 for each 10 minutes of late pick up, after 6:00.

If your camper is to be picked up at noon and they are not picked up by 12:15, the \$10.00 per hour (or portion of an hour) fee will apply.

If you register your camper for four or more sessions, you will receive a 10% discount.

Toddler/Primary Summer Camp Sessions



Ages 18 months to 5 years

Toddler Camp (ages: 18 months – 3 years)

Ten lucky toddlers will have the opportunity to spend a day in a cozy environment designed just for them. The Toddler program will provide an abundance of experiences, activities, and projects in a relaxed, yet stimulating, and nurturing atmosphere. Daily activities will include: small and large motor development, exploring nature, games, gardening, songs, dance, cooking, and much more. The toddlers will also participate in weekly on-site special events and a designated water day.

Primary Camp (ages: 3 – 5 years)

This camp will provide 18 children with a wealth of experiences, activities, and projects in a relaxed, yet stimulating, and nurturing environment. The children will engage in hands-on learning activities that will expose them to science, practical life skills, and sensory explorations. They will also engage in various art projects, games, nature studies, and much more. There will be weekly entertainment along with a designated water day.

NOTE

Both our Toddler and Primary Communities will run similar to our programs we offer throughout the year here at CBMS. Students will be under the guidance of our Montessori employees who will honor Dr. Montessori's philosophy and recommendations from their current classroom guides. Our programs will be enriched through summer fun activities, too.

Each week will highlight a theme related to Summer Fun such as "Back to the Beach", "Fun in the Sun", "Staying Cool in the Summertime", and many more. Students will take part in craft projects, music fun, and organized gross motor activities.

This summer camp will provide your primary child with the fabulous opportunity to continue the many grace and courtesy lessons, community care, practical life, and academic works he/she takes part in throughout the school year. Having even a few weeks of this experience will make the return to school in the fall an easy transition.

Elementary Summer Camp Adventures



Ages 6-12 years old **OR** Rising 1st-6th graders

Week 1: June 20-24

Morning Session: Cooking Clinic

Afternoon Session: Anatomy Camp

During the morning sessions this week, campers will learn the basics in the kitchen. Students will plan, shop, and prepare meals for their daily lunches. Following lunch, the campers will get lessons in basic anatomy and discover different aspects of animal and human development. (Morning campers will need to bring in \$5.00 to help with groceries, however, you will not have to bring a lunch.)

Week 2: June 27-July 1

Morning Session: Botany / Zoology

Afternoon Session: Lego Land Fun & Puzzle Play

During the morning sessions, students will learn and explore the world of Botany through nature. They will also learn about Zoology topics of the child's interests. In the afternoons, the campers will try their skills at various building activities using Legos and K'nex. They will learn how to plan and collaborate on projects and designs. They will also undertake some large jigsaw creations.

Week 3: July 4-8

Morning Session: Brain Gym & Games of Strategy

Afternoon Session: Cultural Studies

This week will be filled with learning opportunities to enhance the campers' current academic skills and challenge their learning during the summer. The mornings will focus on how to prep your brain for the maximum learning potential. There will also be a time of learning strategy games like chess and practicing many brainteasers, puzzle activities, and Mensa games. In the afternoon, students will choose specific cultures they are interested in researching. Students will prepare presentations and visual aides to share with the group.

Week 4: July 11- 15:

Morning & Afternoon Sessions: Arts and Crafts & Outdoor Fun

Both morning and afternoon sessions will be fun-filled with lots of arts and crafts to make and take! Some crafts may be knitting, painting, beading, etc. Campers will also learn playground games and outdoor activities geared at getting children physically active. If campers attend both morning and afternoon, their crafts and outdoor activities will be different to provide variety.
