Thank you for your interest in Carolyn Barron Montessori School. Accredited by the Association Montessori International (AMI), CBMS is a non-denominational, independent Montessori school, located 45 minutes south of Atlanta. We serve students from 18 months to 14 years. We are happy to share information about our program and the Montessori Approach to Learning. The Montessori Method aims for the development of the whole child, ultimately preparing him or her for life's many experiences.

If this will be your child's first experience in a Montessori classroom, we suggest a prospective family first gain a basic understanding of this exciting methodology for learning. We present informational parent education meetings throughout the year and literature and videos are available for your use. We also encourage you to schedule an appointment to observe our classes and tour the CBMS campus.

When the decision to apply is made, complete the enclosed application form, and return it to CBMS with the \$25.00 application fee as soon as possible. Applications are reviewed in the order in which they are received.

Admissions decisions are made by our administration and teaching staff. These decisions are based on an evaluation of the child's visit, school transcripts, and the needs of existing classes with regard to a balance of age, sex, and ethnic diversity. Siblings and children with prior Montessori experience receive priority. If we have an opening, we will schedule a time for your child to visit with a teacher. If a position is offered to your child at this time, the enrollment contract and tuition deposit will be due.

If a place is not immediately available, your child will be placed on our waiting list. We occasionally have families withdraw during the summer months, creating openings. Therefore, we urge parents to remain on the waiting list.

Applications are valid for one year. Families must reapply for acceptance the following year. The application fee is a one-time fee; you will not be charged for updating your application.

Program Information

Our programs are meant to aide children in developing their unique capabilities, to foster an enthusiasm for learning, to support the courage to tackle challenging tasks, and to build a respect and compassion for all living things. To that end, CBMS provides the following environments:

Toddler I and II: Three schedules are available:

For **Toddler I** (18 to 24 months), 3 days per week, (Tuesday/Wednesday/ Thursday) from 8:30 to 11:45. For **Toddler II** (24- 36 months), 5 days per week is offered, with classes from 8:30 to 11:45 (half day) or from 8:30 to 3:00. Full day Toddler must be approved by the teacher due to limited space.

Primary I and II: For children 3 to 6 years old.

Classes are Monday through Friday. Children at this level must be independent in the restroom.

Primary I: from 8:30 to 12:00; **Primary II:** from 8:30 to 3:00.

Elementary: Lower Elementary for students 6 to 9 years old or Upper Elementary for students 9 to 12 years old. Classes are Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 3:00.

Middle School: For students 12 to 14 years old. Classes are Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 3:15.

Note: We value the individual development of each child. Our teaching staff observes and monitors the progress of every student. Teachers will communicate with parents when children are ready to advance to the next program level. Children are moved when they exhibit the social, emotional, intellectual and physical readiness to do so.

Early Bird Care: Childcare is available from 7:30 – 8:30 am.

* Early Bird may be provided in the Toddler/Primary/Elementary communities starting at 7:30 am depending on enrollment. The charge is \$4.00 per hour.

After School Enrichment: For ages 2 and up. Our after school program is designed to allow your child to enjoy art, music, cooking and dance. The children learn from a variety of guest speakers and other special events. The children also enjoy free playtime and outdoor activities. Children who end their classroom time at 12:00 noon may bring their lunch. We provide a quiet time for children who require naps. The current charge for ASE is \$4.00 per hour. During the four week billing cycle, accounts with more than 60 hours will be charged \$3.50/hour. Accounts with more than 100 hours will be charged \$3.00/hour. ASE charges are billed on your monthly statement.

Tuition Policy

A completed Reservation and Enrollment Contract, plus the Tuition Deposit, must be received by February 12, 2010 for re-enrollment and by March 26, 2010 for new enrollment to ensure a place for the 2010-2011 school term. Primary, Elementary, and Middle School payment options are as follows: Option I: pay in full by July 1, 2010; a 6% discount will be deducted from the total tuition due after the tuition deposit and any sibling discounts. Payment option II: monthly payments; to be made in 10 monthly installments from July 1, 2010 to April 1, 2011 which will incur 1% monthly interest, on the balance due. Toddler tuition payments are paid monthly for ten months July-April. A late fee of \$25.00, or 1.5%, whichever is greater, will be assessed on all payments not received by the 10th of the month. Tuition is not refunded after the school year commences. (If your child enters CBMS during the school term, tuition and tuition deposit will be prorated). Children who transition to the next class level during the 2010-2011 school term will be charged the monthly rate at their new level (less any pre-paid tuition) and a prorated amount of the tuition deposit if moving up from the Toddler level. Families with two children enrolled in the Primary, Elementary or Middle School classes receive a 10% discount on the youngest child's tuition, after the tuition deposit. Families with three or more children enrolled in the Primary, Elementary, or Middle School classes receive a 10% discount on the second oldest child's tuition and 30% discount on the third/fourth youngest child/ children's tuition, after the tuition deposit.

Children are evaluated on the basis of readiness for school and potential for success in a Montessori classroom. It is equally important to determine whether the parents' educational philosophy is compatible with that of CBMS. The admissions process consists of submission of an application form and non-refundable registration fee of \$25.00, a child-teacher meeting and a parent observation visit. Older children may be asked to spend time in the classroom. CBMS considers the records of all individual students to be confidential information available to a child's parents or guardians upon request. Records will only be released to other schools or agencies upon signed request from a parent or guardian and only after all accounts are paid in full. The Carolyn Barron Montessori School has a non-discriminatory policy relative to race, color and national origin with respect to the admission of students. What is Montessori?

If you have ever driven past 195 Jackson Street and seen the Carolyn Barron Montessori School sign in front, you may have wondered, "What *is* Montessori?" Hard to pronounce (correctly said mahn-tuh-sore-ee) this unique educational method can be off-putting for parents seeking an excellent education for their children. Montessori education, however, is an amazing experience for both child and parent. The Montessori theory drastically differs from mainstream public, and even private, education. One day of observation in such a setting will leave you impressed and surprised by the learning process so willingly and actively pursued by children in an appropriately prepared classroom.

One of the noticeable distinctions observed in the Montessori classroom is the multi-aged grouping of the children. Children are grouped in three-year spans, based on their ages, and enjoy the same community for this entire period. The philosophy explored and developed by Maria Montessori is to empower children, to develop independence, self-control, and self-discovery, as well as to encourage their desire to learn at their own individual pace. In some children these qualities lie dormant if they are ignored, misunderstood, or poorly trained and utilized. In Montessori classrooms, a child is always learning something that is ultimately preparing him to learn something else, making education continual and joyful. Children are encouraged to move freely about the classroom to pursue their interests, with no time constraints or other external limitations.

Also unlike other classrooms, there are no formal textbooks, and almost no corporate lectures or lessons. Children learn primarily from one another and from the prepared environment. The teacher follows the child's individual interests, and aids investigation on a certain topic or interest, as well as provides an intimate approach to learning as she works with each child individually. She is trained to scientifically observe and record the student's progress, which is not marked by grades or standardized tests. Periodic conferences between parents and teacher mark the student's ongoing progress. A child is successful if he enjoys learning, is happy and kind, and if he is mature and self-controlled.

The Carolyn Barron Montessori School maintains the philosophical and educational components of Maria Montessori's radical yet successful mode of education. The school was founded in Newnan in 1992. There are 165 children enrolled in our Toddler, Primary, Elementary, and Middle School classes. Our children exude the love of learning in a setting that fosters independence and self- and world-discovery. Literature, mathematics, science, history, physical health, art, music, cooking, and nature are interwoven to supply ample hands-on learning opportunities. There is also a focus on community harmony and social responsibility, which develops simultaneously with the child's learning experience.

ADVISEMENTS TO PARENT/GUARDIAN OF APPLICANT FOR ENROLLMENT School Organization

The Carolyn Barron Montessori School, Inc. is a private, non-profit, tax-exempt educational institution, organized and incorporated under the laws of the State of Georgia. It is governed by a Board of Trustees who oversee the mission and operation of the School, as well as supporting its qualified staff. The Board establishes official policies and procedures for the School. The Staff is responsible for admissions, placement, supervision and the overall management of the school.

Equal Opportunity Admissions

The School is an equal opportunity institution that values diversity in its student body and administrative and educational staff. Students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin, religion, or disability are admitted to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded to students at the School. The School does not discriminate on basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin, religion, or disability in its admissions policies and practices.

Enrollment and Placement

Due to limited enrollment opportunities, the Carolyn Barron Montessori School is not able to enroll all applicants. Openings at the Primary and Elementary levels are generally, although not exclusively, filled by re-enrolling students on a "rolling" basis. As openings occur, at any level, which are not filled by re-enrolling students, children with applications on file with the School are invited to enroll in the following order: (1) siblings of presently enrolled students, (2) children with previous Montessori schooling, (3) siblings of formerly enrolled students, (4) other applicants on the waiting list. Enrollment and placement are at the discretion of the School. The School reserves the right to prioritize applicants on the waiting list in order to achieve a balanced gender and chronological age distribution in classes, or for other educational reasons. Acceptance criteria may be subjective in nature: chronological age, developmental maturity, academic progress, and family environment and commitment to the Montessori Method are all considered by the School when reviewing applications for enrollment. Each applicant, regardless of background, however, is considered according to his or her individuality.

Probationary Admissions

Montessori is a unique educational environment. Children new to the School are enrolled as probationary students who are evaluated for a period of six (6) weeks in the Montessori environment. If during or at the completion of the six weeks probationary period, the School determines that the student may be better served beyond the School's Montessori environment, a decision may be made by the School to terminate the probationary student's enrollment. CBMS will prorate and refund any pre-paid tuition. The tuition deposit will not be refunded.

Reservation of Rights

As a private institution dedicated to the pursuit of excellence in the education of all of its enrolled students, the School reserves the rights to discipline, suspend, dismiss, or expel any enrolled student who does not adhere to the standards of the School. The School reserves the right to withdraw a student, if the School determines that such action is in the best interest of the operations of the School, or for the safety and well being of its faculty, staff, employees or students.

Student Records

The School respects the privacy of enrolled students, and to the extent possible will not release records of current or former students without the express written permission of the student's parent/guardian. Records will not be released until all accounts are paid in full.

Submission for Consideration

After having carefully read all of the above information, as the legal guardian of _____ (name of child), who is an applicant for admission to the Carolyn Barron Montessori School, I submit my child's name for consideration for enrollment in the School.
